COWLEY COLLEGE GOLDEN TIGERS

WCE Center - Suite A 221 W. Chestnut Arkansas City, KS. The Cowley College Golden Tigers is an educational program offered to community members who are at least 50 years of age. Through classes, day trips, and workshops, it seeks to provide opportunities that promote the social, intellectual, mental, spiritual, and physical health of its members.

GOLDEN TIGERS 101

ENROLLMENT

Classes and trips are on a firstcome, first-serve basis, and spots cannot be held. If you are unable to attend either enrollment event, you may enroll anytime beginning Friday, January 24th, by contacting Micah in person or via phone or email.

FEES

Fees for classes and trips are paid at the time of enrollment. There is a onetime \$5 semester registration fee, and each class's price is listed in this catalog with the course description. The listed price includes any additional costs or supplies needed.

CREDITS

If you have earned credit via the refund policy or a canceled class, please be sure to use your credit this semester. A full list of credits is available at checkout.

CLASSES

Classes require a minimum of 6 participants for a class to make. If you see one that you really want to take, be sure to invite a friend!

REFUND POLICIES

CLASSES: Refunds are not given if you are unable to attend class. However, you may transfer to another class if space is available.

TRIPS: Refunds for trips are not guaranteed. They are given only for family emergency, illness, or death in the family. A substitute in your place is greatly appreciated if possible.

Transfer and refund credits are subject to an administrative fee and unreturnable supply costs. Credits will be held for 5 years and then considered a donation to the program.

DAY TRIPS

In order to facilitate more fun for more Golden Tigers, individuals will be limited to signing up for only two day trips at enrollment. If you are interested in more than two day trips, you may sign up on the auxiliary waitlist for the additional trips.

ENROLLMENT ESSENTIALS

IN PERSON ENROLLMENT:

Enrolling in person and on paper is quite an orchestrated event. To ensure an orderly process, we will be using a ticket system for our line. Tickets will be available starting at 12pm at Ark City's event and at 10am at Wellington's event. You do not need to arrive this early, but please do not congregate earlier than this. Event doors will open for phased entry approximately 15-30 minutes before each event. Keep in mind that our enrollment events are taking place during the first week of classes for students. Please be courteous of their and other Golden Tigers' experiences.


OPEN ENROLLMENT:

DAY TRIPS

Trip 1: Broadway's The Book of Mormon Sunday, February 16th in Wichita, KS

Trip 2: Greenwood Rising Wednesday, March 5th in Tulsa, OK


This poignant day trip to Tulsa, OK., offers a powerful opportunity for reflection and learning. At the turn of the 20th century, African Americans founded and developed the Greenwood District in Tulsa, popularly known as "Black Wall Street." On this trip, we'll delve into the tragic history of the 1921 Tulsa Race Massacre, visiting Greenwood Rising, a state-of-the-art museum dedicated to telling the story of Black Wall Street and its destruction, for a guided tour. We'll also explore the Greenwood Cultural Center, which celebrates the rich history and



vibrant culture of the Greenwood District. This immersive experience will provide valuable insights into a significant chapter in American history and the enduring resilience of the Black community. The tentative time frame of this trip is 7:30am to 7:00pm. Lunch is included, and the cost is \$55.

Trip 4: Police and Prohibition Tuesday, April 22nd / Ellinwood, KS

To kick off this day trip, we are headed back in time to the Wild West and the prohibition era! In Ellinwood, KS., we will visit the 1894 Historic Wolf Hotel and get a glimpse of life along the Santa Fe Trail during prohibition times. While the rich history of the hotel is fascinating enough, the real intrigue lies below the surface. It's lower level is connected to an underground tunnel system that runs throughout Ellinwood. Once home to a variety of storefront, these tunnels now house a fully functioning prohibition era speakeasy bar that operates on



Fridays and Saturdays. Together, we'll tour the tunnels and travel back in time. Please note, the tunnels on this tour are accessible only by stairs, and the tunnels may find us on slightly uneven ground. There will be places to sit and rest throughout the tour though. After our adventures, we'll head back to modern times at the Kansas Law Enforcement Training Center. We'll learn about the training center, tour their classrooms, and a few lucky Golden Tigers just might get to test out some of their scenario simulators! We'll leave at approximately 7:30am and return to Cowley College around 6:00pm. Lunch is included, and the cost of the trip is \$45.





Community Event Spotlight: "The Bedquilt" One Woman Performance

In a captivating evening of storytelling, actress Michele LaRue will perform "The Bedquilt" by Dorothy Canfield Fisher. "The Bedquilt" - a program of two vibrant, vintage stories - is performed exclusively by LaRue who creates a dozen distinctive characters in her performance. Written in 1906, "The Bedquilt" is a suspenseful tale of a spinster taken for granted by her New England family until she conceives a quilt "beyond which no patchwork pattern could go." The Orphan Train Orphans of Sumner County: Who Were They? Where Did They Go?

In 1850 roughly 15,000 children were homeless on the streets of New York City. They lived in alleys, under bridges and slept on sewage grates. In 1854, what would become known as the Orphan Train Movement began. Between 1854 and 1929, over 200,000 children were placed out through this program. Trains from New York carried children to all 48 continental states and into parts of Canada and about 7,000 were placed in Kansas. Some right here in Sumner County. It is one of the largest social reform relocation efforts in our nation's history and the beginning of documented foster care in America. In this class, Jim Bales of the Chisholm Trail Museum will share about the Orphan Train orphans that were placed in Sumner County.
